Fresh expressions of church


- A form of church for our changing culture, established primarily for the benefit of people who do not attend any church
- Missional
- Contextual
- Formational
- Ecclesial

A 'mixed economy' 'the new normal'

- 'In the Church of England today, bishops undertake to pursue and support the full range of contributions to mission and church growth ... creating and normalising a pattern of diversity, of parish and other traditional forms alongside newer forms.
- This pattern of diversity is the 'new normal'. It requires leadership from bishops in leading our dioceses into understanding and embracing this diversity.' The House of Bishops



A process of discernment




underpinned by prayer, ongoing listening and relationship with the wider church



CAFE

- Care for and serve people outside the church
- Adapt to the context. Listen to the people you serve and enter their worlds
- Form disciples. Journey with people to help them discover Jesus and grow to be more like Jesus
- Express church where life happens.
 These are not bridges to an existing church, but forms of church for others in the midst of their lives

Discernment

Discernment

• The location, character, style and missional focus of a fresh expression emerge, and are then directed, through a process of discernment; through a focused and deliberate attentiveness to the Holy Spirit.

Why?

 Because mission is not primarily our activity, which we ask God to empower and bless, but God's activity in which we participate.

• 'It is not the church that has a mission of salvation to fulfil in the world; it is the mission of the Son and the Spirit through the Father that includes the church. Creating a church as it goes on its way.' Jurgen Moltmann

It is Jesus' ministry continuing by the Holy Spirit

- 'The mission of the Church is the gift of participating, through the Holy Spirit, in the Son's mission from the Father to the world.' James Torrance
- Jn. 20: ²¹ Jesus said to them, as the Father has sent (continues to send) me, so I send you. ²² When he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, 'Receive the Holy Spirit....'

Seeing what God is doing and joining in

'The Great Commission' Matthew 28:16-20


- 'Make Disciples' is the central command

The Heart of Discipleship

- The heart of discipleship is obedience to Jesus
- The motivation for discipleship is a vision of Jesus and his Kingdom
- Part of God's work is to make us like Jesus



Be Intentional

Make the fresh expression itself about discipleship from beginning to end.

Aim to provide an experience of Christian community for those with little contact.

Allow for the long journey people go on as they come from initial attention to openness to respond to the gospel. Paul Moore

Start as you mean to go on!

 Build sacrifice and service into the culture of the fresh expression from the beginning

• Don't create an environment so comfortable that it gives no hint of the cost of discipleship, or the call to serve

Staging posts - Sorted

- Contact work
- Club night
- Praise service
- Peer-led discipleship groups

- One to one
- Appropriate courses

Shaping the Church

• Fresh expressions take through an incarnational ministry the Holy Spirit forms the body of Christ.

Incarnational Mission

- 'When we expound both the what and the how of mission incarnationally, we need to be careful always to emphasise that the incarnation is the unique event that founds and forms the church's witness.
- The event defines how it is to be embodied and thus communicated.'

'Christ's Mission in Christ's Way'

 'Jesus was sent to walk in and with people of a particular culture and time. Incarnational mission

- 'To practice incarnational witness means learning the cultures into which we are sent: learning what they think and how they think, what it feels like to be part of their world, and how to communicate on their terms.' Darrell Guder
- Founders of a new ecclesial communitywill put themselves in other people's place, they will walk with Jesus in the shoes of those they encounter.' Michael Moynagh
